

## Israel's Independence Day Rally in Montreal, Canada



Two friends of Beth Ariel, a married couple in their sixties, who drove into Montreal, from the US (7 hour drive) just to attend the Independence Day

Rally for Israel which was held yesterday, Tuesday, May 14<sup>th</sup>.

As believing Gentiles from the nations who love the Lord and who deeply love Israel, they were very excited to share this love at the rally by being there, praying and by offering comfort cards to the many Jewish people who were in attendance during this two-hour rally.

Here are some comments they received when Jewish people saw the small identity sticker she had stapled to her jacket and he had placed on his hat. Many others from our congregation also wore this badge in order to show their solidarity and love.



"We are so thankful to have participated in this rally. We were very touched by the great responses we received. After we had the sign, *We are Christians who love Israel* stapled to our coat and hat, we were told by Beth Ariel's Messianic Leader J. Isaac, to go out there into the crowd and be amazed at the response we would get. He was so right!

In the first 5 minutes we spoke with three men and had a great conversation especially with one man who said, "You've got it! So many people do not understand". One of the things he mentioned was the prevailing assumption that the Jews killed Jesus, so we were able to share the quote from Jesus, when He said that no one takes His life from Him but that He laid it down on His own accord.

There were a number of people we shared with, speaking of how Yeshua came the first time in fulfillment of the Passover lamb and that on His second coming He would fulfill the seventh Feast of Israel, and complete His promise to tabernacle with His people. In another conversation, after sharing the same

information, the man wanted to shake our hand and he took a step back and said, "Whoa, you know more about this than I do!" We knew that he understood just what we were saying, and we told him to read his scriptures.


One of our favorite encounters came when we met a woman in her 30's who then went to get her dad and brought him over to us. He lived in Israel and then he went to bring another friend over, and they took pictures with us. The friend said he wanted to put this picture up at his place of business!

Another conversation with was with a young Jewish lady who was half Moroccan. She had come over while we had initiated a conversation with her friend. She asked if we believed in the trinity to which we answered, "We believe Psalm 2 which says that God has a Son". Many women hugged us with tears in their eyes

There was a woman who showed us a picture of her cousin, who was a hostage. We shared with this young lady that God impressed on our heart the passage from Isaiah 40, "Comfort, comfort my people". We told her that we had felt this longing before leaving to Israel when we went to do some work there and that we were in Israel on Oct 7 when the massacre had happened.

Many were especially touched when we told them that we travelled 7 hours to be there that day, and they hugged us like we was part of their family. This openness allowed many to take the comfort cards we had and when people were hesitant to take a card, we just told them that these were Hebrew Scriptures which were offered to give them comfort at this time.

If those ordinances depart from before Me, says the Lord, then the seed of Israel shall also cease from being a nation before Me forever ... Jeremiah 31:35-36


G-d's Promises to Israel

There were around 17 people from Beth Ariel Congregation who came out in support of Israel and many wore the sign stapled to their sweater or hat and helped to distribute some 250 comfort cards to the Jewish people who were there. What a blessing that day was!

Needless to say, the presence of those who oppose Israel were also there, just across the street. There was a strong police presence, but order was kept. We did hear some anti-Israel chanting from across the street and on two occasions, they emitted some foul-smelling pink gas, which could be breathed in from across that street. There were no other incidents, and we left the rally confident that God had walked before us, preparing us to be a light and an encouragement to the many with whom we did engage.



### Walk and Talk Outreach



They were able to speak to a Jewish woman who again was upset at the situation in Israel. She shared her thoughts with them and they in turn told her that God knew everything and that they were there to give out His word, the Tanakh and the Brit Chadashah. She already had a Tanakh at home so she received the Brit. This woman also asked if they were Jewish...
